WATERCOLOR CLASSES



We will work from still life, exploring transparency and opacity. The emphasis will be on composition, color, and issues related to the medium. Students will receive individual attention and instruction as well as critiques.

You'll need a palette, paints, paper, brushes and a good light source to create shadows. You will be asked to get things for your setup — possibly two red apples, or an eggplant and an egg, etc.

Some of you already have most of the supplies, but let me know if you need the list of specific matierials for class.

There will be a total of 8 sessions of 2 hours each for \$225.
